



Biography of Lydie EVRARD ASN Commissioner

Lydie EVRARD was born on 5th June 1972 in Meudon (92). She is a former student of the École nationale supérieure des mines of Douai and the École nationale supérieure du pétrole et des moteurs (Institut français du pétrole). She holds the status of Chief Engineer of the Corps des mines.

Lydie EVRARD began her career in 1995 in the Ministry for Industry's General Directorate for Energy and Raw Materials, as engineer responsible for reviewing oil field developments and for examining the corresponding mining rights.

In 2000, she joined the Ile-de-France Regional Directorate for Industry, Research and the Environment (DRIRE), with responsibility for the Yvelines *département* sub-division, in charge of monitoring facilities classified on environmental protection grounds.

In 2006, she became deputy head of ASN's Paris regional division, in charge of a team of radiation protection inspectors, responsible for nuclear medicine, interventional radiology, industrial radiology and monitoring and inspection of sites and soils polluted by radioactive substances.

From 2010 to 2013, Lydie EVRARD held the position of head of ASN's Waste, Research Facilities and Fuel Cycle Facilities Department (DRC), the scope of which also covers decommissioning and polluted sites and soils. During this period, she in particular took part in drafting the national radioactive materials and waste management plan (PNGMDR 2013-2015) and the stress tests performed on research and fuel cycle facilities, following the Fukushima Daiichi accident.

In 2013, she joined the Ministry for the Economy and Finance, where she acted as interministerial delegate for standards and deputy director for standardisation, product regulation and metrology at the General Directorate for Enterprise. In this capacity, she was tasked with coordinating and regulating the French standardisation system. She was Government Commissioner for the French standards association, the French accreditation committee and the national metrology and testing Laboratory. She also coordinated the network of decentralised metrology departments located within the Regional Directorates for Enterprise, Competition, Consumption, Labour and Employment (DIRECCTE).

Further to a proposal from the President of the Senate, Lydie EVRARD was appointed ASN Commissioner for a six-year term by decree of the President of the Republic on 10th March 2017.
