ASN'S STRATEGY OVERSIGHT

ASN's strategic aims for 2007-2009 are focused on consolidating its legitimacy, enabling it to exercise its duties and strengthen its credibility. These strategic aims are naturally reflected in the annual action plan(s) of each ASN service.

CONSOLIDATE THE LEGITIMACY OF ASN

Enable the commission to play its role

ASN is run by a five-member commission. This commission embodies the Authority and takes the most important decisions. The way its members are appointed is a guarantee of their independence.

Owing to the diversity of its membership and the way it works, the commission contributes to thorough and fair supervision of nuclear safety and radiation protection.

Under the authority of the Chairman, it builds ASN's strategy and doctrine and acts as its driving force.

On behalf of ASN it adopts a public stance on key subjects within the competence of the Authority.

Develop a common management culture

Internal rules, drafted by the commission, organise ASN's management structures. A small board and a larger management committee are headed by the Director General. Regional delegates represent ASN around the country.

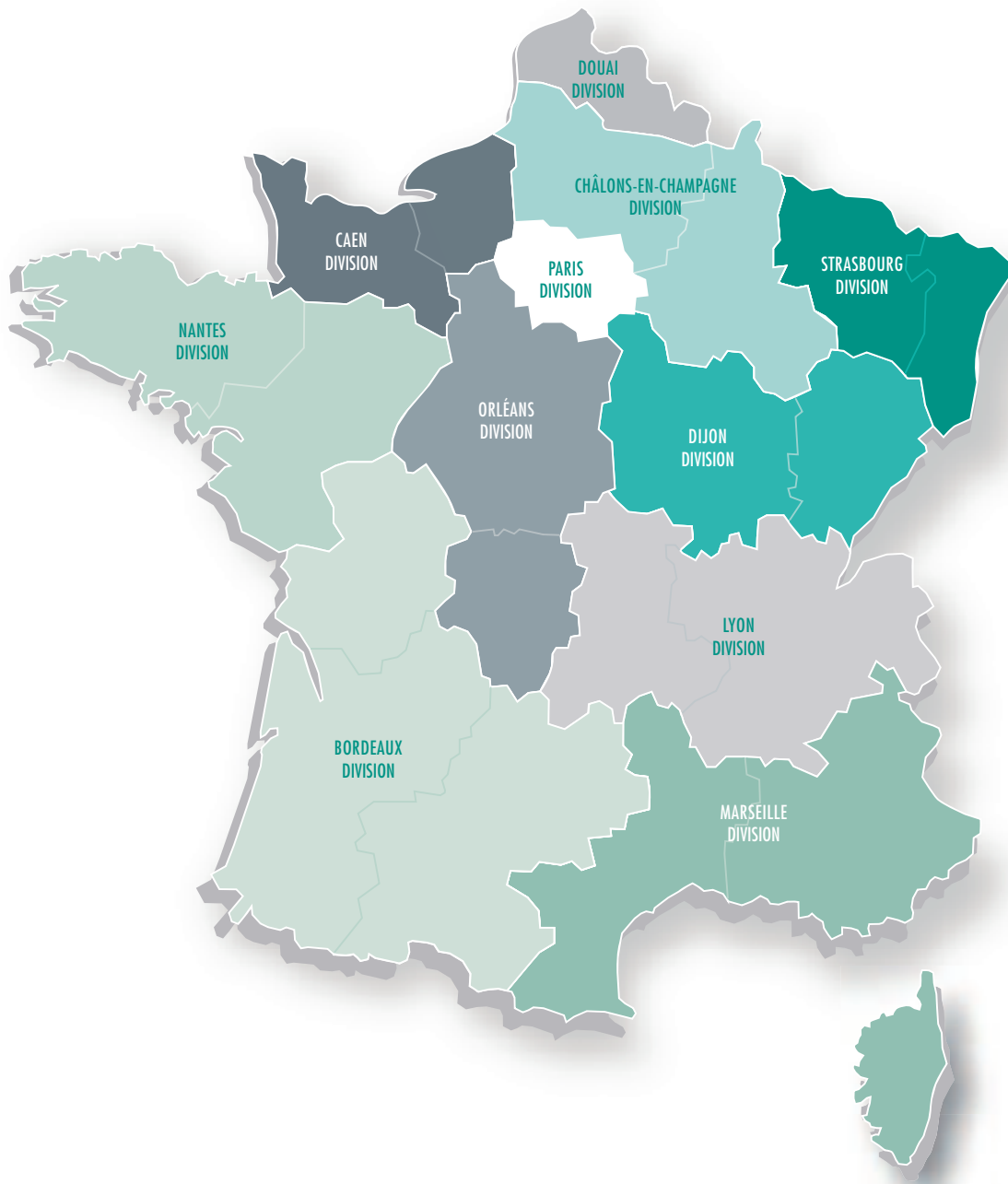
The respective roles and duties of each person must be clearly established.

Information systems are organised and the rules for decision-making and delegation of powers and of signature are formalised and clarified, in order to guarantee the robustness, quality and consistency of the decisions taken by ASN.

ASN's management must make a firm commitment in this direction: the commission and top management at ASN must develop a common culture to ensure unity and consistency within it.

ASN'S REGIONAL ORGANISATION

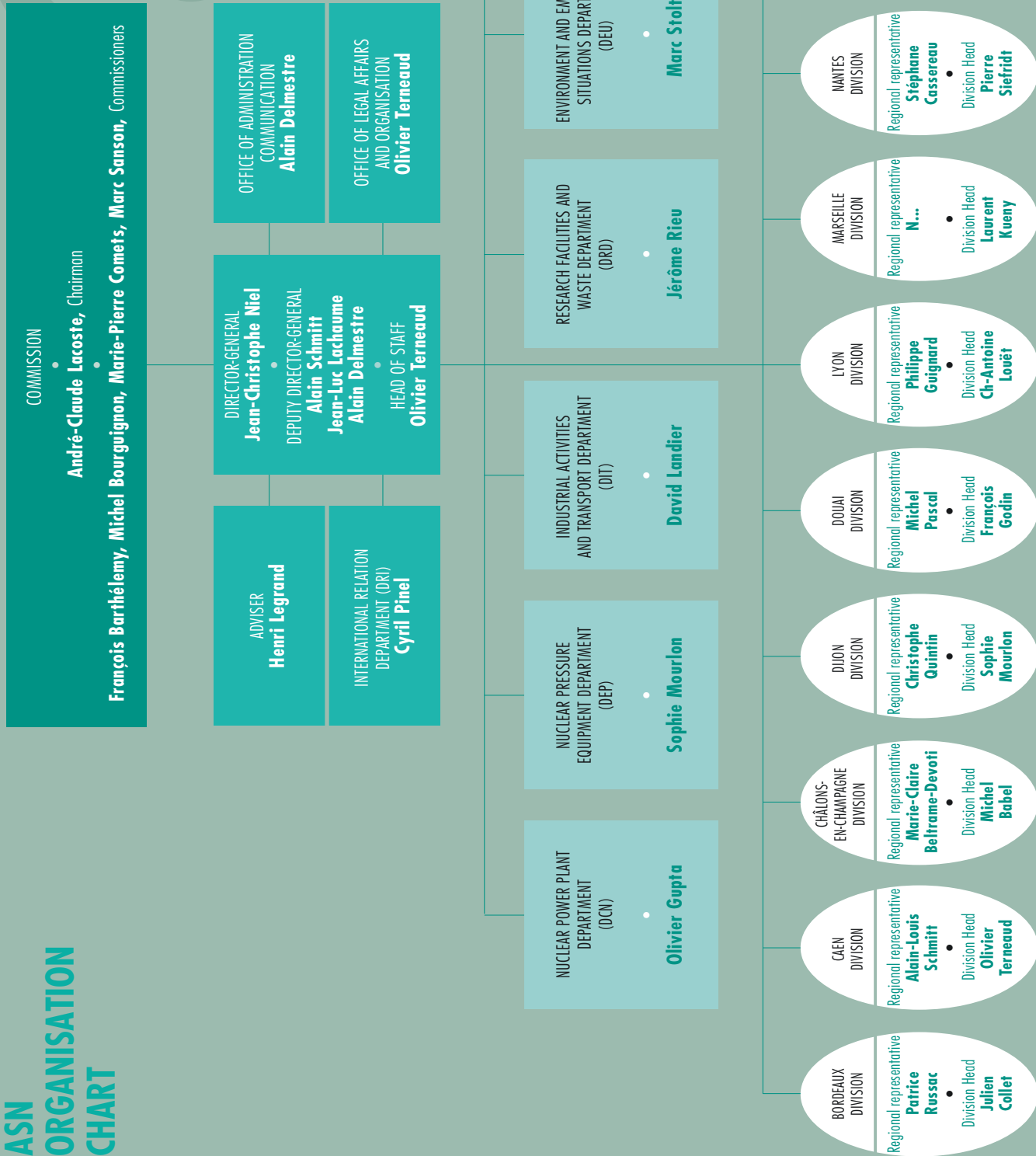
This map shows the 11 ASN divisions in France and their geographical areas of responsibility. They are led by the heads of division, under the control of ASN regional representatives.



The Paris division operates in Martinique, Guadeloupe, La Réunion, French Guyana and Saint-Pierre & Miquelon.

The Caen and Orléans divisions operate in the Brittany and Ile-de-France regions respectively for BNI supervision only.
