

## Biography of Laure Tourjansky Commissioner of ASN, the French Nuclear Safety Authority

Born on 24 January 1966 in Saint-Cloud, Laure Tourjansky graduated from the Ecole Normale Supérieure of Fontenay Saint-Cloud in the Humanities, and is General Engineer of Bridges, Water and Forests. She also has a doctorate in economics from the Paris Institute of Political Studies and a higher teaching diploma in economic and social sciences.

She began her career in 1995 as project manager in the sectoral studies bureau (energy, transport, infrastructure) at the Forecasting Directorate of the Ministry of Economy and Finance. From 1998 to 2000 Laure Tourjansky was also Rapporteur to the Competition Council.

From 2000 to 2003 she held the position of head of the "resources and local services" at the Directorate of Economic Studies and Environmental Assessment at the Ministry in charge of Sustainable Development, then became head of the "infrastructures, transport and development" bureau in the same directorate until 2007. She then joined the General Directorate of Risk Prevention (DGPR) as head of the Waste Management Policy Department.

In 2010 Laure Tourjansky was appointed Deputy Director of the Ile-de-France Regional and Interdepartmental Directorate of the Environment and Energy, and subsequently, from 2014 until 2016, Deputy Director of Maritime Fishing and Aquaculture at the Ministry in charge of Sustainable Development.

Since 2016 she has been head of the Natural and Water-related Hazards Department within the DGPR at the Ministry of Ecological Transition).

By decree of 21 April 2021, Laure Tourjansky has been appointed member of the Commission of ASN, the French Nuclear Safety Authority, for the remaining term of the mandate of Ms Lydie Evrard.
